

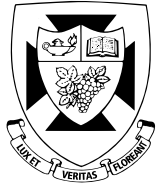

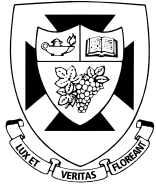
It is a great pleasure for me to be with you on this special occasion, to shake your hand and wish you well as you set out on the next venture in your life.



## James Eldridge, BA, MA Honorary Doctorate of Laws

James Eldridge’s career in the Manitoba public service spans 37 years—serving under six premiers and creating the first department of intergovernmental affairs in 1982. Throughout his career he worked to ensure that Manitoba’s voice would be heard at the federal level. His expertise and ability in economics and policy formation, with a stellar talent for intergovernmental affairs, is visionary.

Eldridge has served as a liaison for Manitoba with other western provinces and the federal government on economic and intergovernmental files, attending most First Ministers’ and Premiers’ meetings since the early 1970s and Western Premiers’ meetings since 1990.

Throughout his career, which included serving as Deputy Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs and as Clerk of the Executive Council, Eldridge has demonstrated commitment to the highest levels of integrity and professionalism. Eldridge retired in 2004 but continues to serve as an advisor on intergovernmental relations and as an advisor to the Manitoba Business Council.

Eldridge also serves on several boards including the Queen’s University Institute of Intergovernmental Relations and the Order of Manitoba Advisory Council. He also sits on the boards of the Royal Winnipeg Ballet, Partners in the Park and the Canada West

Foundation. He has been recently honoured with a number of awards including the Lieutenant-Governor’s Medal for Excellence in Public Administration in Manitoba, an award for leadership promoting collaboration and cooperation between the Western Governors Association and the Western Premiers Conference by the Governor of Colorado as well as by the Manitoba Chambers of Commerce and Canadian Manufacturers and Exporters for advancing business-government relations in Manitoba in 2004 and 2005.

The University of Winnipeg is proud to present James Eldridge with an Honorary Doctorate of Laws in recognition of his dedication to Manitoba and Canada and for his tireless efforts in public service to ensure harmonious relations between the federal and provincial governments.



## Joyce Milgaard, Honorary Doctorate of Laws

Joyce Milgaard’s name is synonymous with justice. Her relentless 20 year pursuit of justice in clearing her son David’s name, of a crime and sentenced to life in prison for a crime he did not commit in 1969. After her son was freed in 1992 she spent another seven years fighting for his complete exoneration and compensation for time served.

Her relentless pursuit of clearing her son David Milgaard of a wrongful conviction has made her an icon for truth and justice. Her dedication is also an example of the unyielding love of mother for her son.

Milgaard has been named to the *Maclean’s* Magazine Honour Roll and was awarded the Canada 125 Anniversary Medal for “significant contribution to fellow citizens, their community or Canada.” She remains involved with the John Howard Society as an Honorary Board Member and she is regional director of the Association in Defense of the Wrongfully Convicted, a national organization.

Milgaard frequently speaks at schools and universities in Canada and the U.S. in defense of the wrongly convicted. She has written a book, *A Mother’s Story* and has been the subject of numerous documentaries. She has also inspired a symphony piece entitled *Milgaard* written and performed by the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra that premiered at the 2000 Winnipeg New Music Festival. Milgaard appears frequently on television on various community issues. Prior to becoming her son’s advocate she was trained and working as a Christian Science nurse.

For her contributions in pursuing truth and justice for her son, as well as other wrongfully convicted individuals, The University of Winnipeg is pleased to award Joyce Milgaard with an Honorary Doctorate of Laws .







## Randall Moffat, (Collegiate '61) CM Honorary Doctorate of Laws

Randall Moffat, a founding director of The University of Winnipeg Foundation, is known as the "quiet philanthropist." The former Chairman of Moffat Communications Ltd. is credited with expanding the company's holdings to include additional radio and television stations across Canada and the United States thanks to his steady leadership and vision. In 1995 Moffat championed the advancement of women in the broadcasting industry by creating specialty channel the Women's Television Network.

By 2001 Moffat had sold all the parts of Moffat Communications ending a 38-year successful career in broadcasting. In December 2001, he made an unprecedented gift of \$100 million to The Winnipeg Foundation to establish the Moffat Family Fund. Moffat's personal philosophy, the vision statement of the Moffat Family Fund, is "a Canadian society where all individuals have equal opportunity to develop their potential."

Philanthropy has always been in Moffat's blood. In 1972, he served as the Chair of the United Way of Winnipeg's annual campaign. At age 29, he was the youngest individual to serve in this role. In 1999, to mark Moffat Communication's 50th anniversary in Manitoba, it established a \$500,000 endowment to support Youth Connections, a granting program that supports youth-initiated, youth driven community action projects with a local benefit.



Moffat has served the community by building a strong social and business community as he shared his insight and wisdom as a director to a number of corporations. Known for his modest and unassuming style, Moffat's accomplishments have been recognized

by his peers. In 1996 Canadian Women in Communications awarded Moffat and Moffat Communications "Employer of the Year" for facilitating the advancement of women within their organizations. In 2004, he was named to the Canadian Association of Broadcasters' Hall of Fame for outstanding achievements and contributions to private broadcasting and to Canada. In 2005, Moffat was honoured by his country for a lifetime of distinguished service to Canadian broadcasting, and his commitment to social and business development and was invested as a Member, Order of Canada

The University of Winnipeg is honoured to present Randall Moffat with an Honorary Doctorate of Laws for his inspiring philanthropy, his community involvement and his commitment to helping young people and the socially and economically disadvantaged members of our society.

## Steven Schipper, (Dip.) NTS Honorary Doctorate of Letters

Steven Schipper attended Bishop's College and Mc Gill University before graduating from the National Theatre School in Montréal in 1978. Since then Schipper has made a mark on and behind the scenes of Canadian stages. Since 1989, he has served as Artistic Director of the Manitoba Theatre Centre and has been credited with bringing financial stability and artistic success to MTC. He also has championed Canadian plays and their premieres on the stage and has offered an array of classics and contemporary hits at MTC.

Schipper has played an integral role in the field of the dramatic arts in all levels on a national and provincial scale. He has directed close to three dozen plays and was the associate director at the Stratford Festival in 1984. He also is the recipient of the David Peacock Award. He has promoted the profile of local theatre and supporting local talent in all fields of the dramatic arts.



His theatrical triumphs include world premieres including local writer Maureen Hunter's *Transit of Venus* (1992-93) and *Atlantis* (1995-96). In 1995, Schipper brought Hollywood actor Keanu Reeves to Winnipeg to play Hamlet, and has throughout his tenure cast extensively from the local acting community. Under his leadership, MTC has been called "the most successful regional theatre in the Canada," balancing artistic risks with classics and attracting an estimable list of theatre artists creating "an artistic renaissance."

The University of Winnipeg is proud to present Steven Schipper with an Honorary Doctorate of Letters for his outstanding contribution to theatre and the arts in Manitoba.



## Reginald Skene, BA, B.Ed., MA, PhD Fellowship in United College

Dr. Reginald Skene's vision and leadership was the catalyst that created The University of Winnipeg's Department of Theatre and Drama. Under Skene's guidance the present pre-professional program, the Department of Theatre & Drama flourished and gained respect as one of Canada's premiere theatre programs.

In 1967, while a member of the English Department, he was appointed Director of Theatre. At the time, there was only one curricular course in theatre and a modest extra-curricular production program. Under Skene's leadership this 'extra' was developed into a full Department of Theatre and Drama by 1982. Currently The University of Winnipeg has a four-year pattern of theatre education, a four production mainstage season and an ambitious studio season, all operating on a professional model.

Skene obtained his Bachelor of Arts (Honours), Bachelor of Education and a Master's of Arts from the University of Manitoba and earned his Doctor of Philosophy at the University of Toronto. He became a faculty member of The University of Winnipeg in 1965.

His scholarly interests cover the spectrum of the theatre including, History of Theatre in Winnipeg, Theatrical and Dramatic Criticism, Shakespearean Interpretation, Theory of Acting, Actor Training, Theatre Aesthetics and Directing Technique.

Skene has been an external examiner of the Hong Kong Academy of Performing Arts, School of Drama in 2001, evaluating the school's Bachelor of Fine Arts program in drama and has been a consultant for Manitoba Arts Council.

Skene has contributed to countless books and journal articles, as well as serving as the theatre critic on CBC Radio and in the *Winnipeg Free Press*.

Currently Senior Scholar at UWinnipeg, Skene retired in 2002 after 37 years. During his career, Skene held leadership positions in The University of Winnipeg Faculty Association for 15 years and also sustained a multi-faceted professional career as a productive scholar, writer, reviewer and director.

Dr. Reginald Skene will be admitted into Fellowship in United College for his vision and leadership in establishing The University of Winnipeg's Department of Theatre.



## J.F. Reeh Taylor, QC, LLB Fellowship in The University of Winnipeg

J.F. Reeh Taylor, Senior Counsel with Taylor McCaffrey LLP, served as UWinnipeg's long-time legal counsel and has contributed greatly to The University of Winnipeg and general communities. Taylor is the Director of the Small Business Law Clinic at the Faculty of Law at the University of Manitoba. This clinic provides advice and guidance to small business operators as well as provides mentorship and instruction to law students.

Taylor was acknowledged by the Manitoba Bar Association with its Distinguished Service Award in 1993. Another achievement of Taylor's was founding the Canadian Association of University Solicitors where he served as its first president

He is also dedicated to the community and has served on many community boards that cover his diversified interests. A great supporter of the arts, Taylor was co-founder of Virtuosi Concerts Inc. and the Manitoba Chamber Orchestra, and has served on the board of Virtuosi Concerts for a decade. He is past-president of the Manitoba Opera Association, The Manitoba Club, the Winnipeg Executives

Association and the Manitoba Chamber Orchestra. He also is a contributing force behind the creation of the beloved Leo Mol Sculpture Garden at Assiniboine Park.

A 'Renaissance man' who loves law, literature, music and the arts, Taylor's legacy is one of service to the community and leading by example. Taylor was born in Forest, Ontario. He attended Cardiff University in South Wales and the Law Society's School of Law in London, England. He then came to Manitoba and attended the University of Manitoba's Law School and was called to the Bar in 1951. He is married to Pamela Maureen and is the father of five.

## Bob Bector, B.Sc., M.Sc.

### The Clifford J. Robson Memorial Award for Excellence in Teaching

Bob Bector is an Instructor in Mathematics & Statistics at The University of Winnipeg. He is described as the "consummate professional" for presenting well-prepared and well-organized lectures, well-designed and extremely fair tests and providing excellent support to his students and his colleagues.

Originally from India, he came to Manitoba in 1975. Bector earned his Bachelor of Science and his Master of Science at the University of Manitoba. He began teaching at the University of Manitoba and joined The University of Winnipeg's Mathematics and Statistics Department in 1985 and has been a favoured professor ever since. Bector sets high standards for his students and helps them attain these standards by giving his students the tools to tackle the math at hand. He simplifies concepts and is available after class to assist his students in understanding. When asked about why teaching, he responds with a smile, "It's in my blood. My grandfather was a math teacher and I have always wanted to be a teacher."

One of his nominators wrote, "He simplifies concepts until the class understands them. Rather than just providing theorems, Mr. Bector conveys meaning behind the theories."



Bector is especially known for his Introduction to Calculus class. He systematically and thoroughly covers the topic and provides his students with a solid and rigorous training in calculus. He also goes to every lab to ensure the students get the help they need and to help answer questions even though there is a lab instructor he says, "I want to give them choices, some are trying and struggling and I try to give them individual attention to help them understand." Bector's students on average consistently outperform the other math sections and Bector's colleagues recognize him as a consummate team player.

The University of Winnipeg is proud to present Bob Bector with The Clifford J. Robson Memorial Award for Excellence in Teaching.

## Craig Cooper, BA (Hons.), MA, PhD

### The Robin H. Farquhar Award for Excellence in Contributing to Self-Governance

Dr. Craig Cooper is currently Associate Professor and Chair of the Classics Department at The University of Winnipeg. His exemplary work in the area of self-governance is demonstrated by his collegial, effective and dedicated service to more than 40 University and faculty committees including as Chair of the Faculty Council of Arts & Science nominating committee, President of the Faculty & Staff Club, Member and Chair of the Chairs' Caucus, Senator and Board of Regents member.

Cooper earned his Bachelor of Honours at the University of Alberta before he headed to the pacific coast and completed his Master of Arts and Doctor of Philosophy at the University of British Columbia. He came to The University of Winnipeg in 1993.

His vast administrative responsibilities at the University began in 1998 and have not waned. Currently he serves on over a dozen committees with his trademark effectiveness, energy and dedication. Neil Besner, Associate Vice-President, (International), describes Cooper as "a superbly effective Chair: one who advocated strongly



and successfully for his Department, but was keenly aware of the larger issues attending the Humanities Area, the Faculty of Arts and Science and the University."

Cooper holds numerous professional memberships across the country and the globe including the American Philological Association, Archaeological Institute of America and the Classical Association in Britain. ## Roger Kingsley, BA (Hons.), M.Math., PhD

### The Clarence Atchison Award for Excellence in Community Service

Dr. Roger Kingsley has always been an active community member, devoting much of his volunteer time and service to a variety of organizations. His primary work has been with Scouts Canada and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada on the local, provincial and national levels over the past 30 years.

Kingsley has served Scouts Canada on many levels and over several years. In 2002, he was elected to the Scouts Canada Board of Governors and served for three years. Kingsley also served as Chair of the Audit Committee and contributed to the fiscal health and sustainability of the organization.

As a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada, Kingsley served on parish councils as well as various province-wide committees contributing to all levels related to running a parish. During this time he also served as a member of a blue-ribbon panel at the national level to provide recommendations on how to deal with conflict within a congregation.

## Mary Young, BA, PBCE, M.Ed., PhD

### The Marsha Hanen Award for Excellence in Creating Community Awareness

Dr. Mary Young has been an inspiration to those that know her. The issues she addresses range from healing the residential school experience, combating racism and discrimination, incorporating the wisdom of Elders into modern society and ensuring the survival of Aboriginal languages. She has worked diligently to reconnect many Aboriginal young people with their home communities, culture and languages.

Young began working at The University of Winnipeg in 1984 as Native Student Advisor/ Counsellor. She became director of Aboriginal Student Services in 2003. Young will also be joining the Faculty of Education as a tenured Assistant Professor this Fall.

Young continuously reaches out to the community participating in fostering cross-cultural understanding and harmony through conferences and think-tanks. Her connection to UWinnipeg and other community agencies has solidified change for a better community. She has made a tangible difference in thinking and improved the lives of many individuals.

Young serves on several boards including Louis Riel Institute, Urban Circle and the Aboriginal Education Research Forum. Young has also served on the UWinnipeg Task Force Committee, initiated an Elder

in Residence Program and named the Wii Chiwaakanak Learning Centre, an example of a 'partnership' between the University and the community.

Young has experienced first hand the tragedy of residential schools, the separation from family and racial stereotyping creating a woman that has overcome adversity and made her community a better place. Her hopes and shared lessons with academics and members of her community work towards healing and growth for all participants.

Young obtained her Bachelor of Arts at The University of Winnipeg, her Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in Education and her Master in Education at the University of Manitoba and her Doctor of Philosophy from the University of Alberta.

The University of Winnipeg is honoured to present Dr. Mary Young with The Marsha Hanen Award for Excellence in Creating Community Awareness for serving as a voice for Aboriginal peoples and education at The University of Winnipeg and in the community at large.





## David Martin, BA (Class of '83) Distinguished Alumni Award

Like many people, David Martin was once afraid of public speaking. More than afraid—"I was terrified!" he admits. But when a fellow student approached him and asked if he'd like to join the University's debating team, he knew an opportunity when he saw it. "The best way to get over my fear was to just do it," says Martin. He joined the team, and went on to discover just how valuable a degree in politics could be when coupled with the skill to speak your mind and hold your ground. "I've been in front of the media a lot throughout my career," says Martin, who worked for the Manitoba League of Persons with Disabilities for 17 years. "That job was quite political," he adds, putting it mildly. During his days as an advocate, he became a regular source for comment on high-profile issues including the Robert Latimer case, a landmark court battle involving a father who killed his disabled daughter.

Throughout his career, Martin has been active in the development of many government policies and programs which support those with disabilities. He spent four years making a difference for people living with disabilities through his work at Ten Ten Sinclair Housing, Inc. As Managing Director of the place he once called home, Martin oversaw Ten Ten and six other buildings connected with the organization. As well as being a transitional residence, Ten Ten offers programs that teach independent living skills, like how to

access community resources, manage equipment, and direct attendant staff.

Since 2004, Martin has served as Executive Director of the Province of Manitoba's Disabilities Issues Office. His community involvement includes the Community Health Advisory Council for Seven Oaks/Inkster, the Muscular Dystrophy Association of Canada, Equal Rights Advisory Committee, Court Challenges Program of Canada, Council of Canadians with Disabilities and the Winnipeg Regional Housing Authority.



"David has dedicated the better part of his life to better the lives of others," describes Jason Pusiewich, President of The University of Winnipeg Alumni Association. "To honour someone that has brought honour to so many others made sense to the Alumni Association. We are humbled by the work David has done, and continues to do every day."

David Martin will receive the Distinguished Alumni Award for his work championing, advocating on behalf of and improving the lives of people with disabilities.

## **THE CLIFFORD J. ROBSON MEMORIAL AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING**

In 1971, Dr. John Zubeck of the University of Manitoba was instrumental in establishing the Robson Award in memory of Dr. Clifford J. Robson, one of The University of Winnipeg's finest teachers and a tireless worker on behalf of students. This award commemorates Dr. Robson's contribution to the teaching of psychology in this province and recognizes a University of Winnipeg faculty member who shares Dr. Robson's reputation for dedication and love of teaching. Nominations are accepted from the entire University community and the recipient is chosen by a committee made up of faculty, staff, and students.

## **THE ROBIN H. FARQUHAR AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN CONTRIBUTING TO SELF-GOVERNANCE**

This award was established in 1989 by the University Board of Regents in honour of Dr. Robin H. Farquhar, the third President of The University of Winnipeg. The purpose of the award is to recognize a University faculty or staff member who contributes significantly to the self-governance function of the University. Dr. Farquhar valued the efforts of those who volunteer their time to serve on committees, boards, and task forces, thus maintaining the traditional and important autonomous nature of a university. Nominations for this award are requested from faculty and staff and the recipient is chosen by a committee representing constituencies of the University.

## **THE CLARENCE ATCHISON AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN COMMUNITY SERVICE**

The Clarence Atchison Award for Community Service was established by Investors Group in honour of their former President and Vice-Chair, Clarence E. Atchison. Together with an impressive record of business accomplishments, Dr. Atchison devoted many hours to community and social service in Winnipeg, serving on many boards and advisory councils. He was a long-time member of the University of Winnipeg Board of Regents, acting as Chair from 1968 to 1970. The award is given to a University faculty or staff member to recognize the contribution given of their time and expertise to service to the community.

## **THE MARSHA HANEN AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN CREATING COMMUNITY AWARENESS**

The Marsha Hanen Award for Excellence in Creating Community Awareness is funded by the Toronto Dominion Bank in honour of the fourth president of The University of Winnipeg. 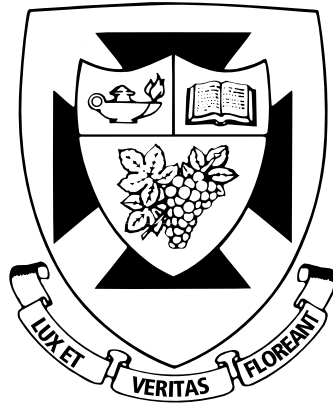

## The University of Winnipeg Coat of Arms

*The Coat of Arms of The University of Winnipeg was officially adopted by the governing bodies of the University during the academic session of 1972–73.*

*The elements found within the Coat of Arms have been associated over the years with both Manitoba and Wesley Colleges, the ancestors of United College. The bunch of grapes in the lower portion of the inner shield derives from the Coat of Arms of Manitoba College. The grape symbol has its origin in the College seal adopted in the charter of 1871. The cross, the lamp, and the open book derive from the Coat of Arms of Wesley College, designed in 1897 by Dr. J.H. Riddell. The cross, the symbol of sacrificial service in the interest of humanity, was the basis for his design and upon it he placed a shield, the symbol of protection. The lamp, the symbol of light, also represents learning, to which the Colleges have been devoted for over a century in the Province of Manitoba. The open book, representing instruction in the way of life and the bringing of understanding to the student, symbolizes knowledge in a general sense, although it may carry overtones of the Holy Scriptures in a more limited interpretation.*

*The motto, placed upon a scroll below, is the United College motto, here retained: Lux et Veritas Floreant (Let Light and Truth Flourish). The words catch the central import of the lamp (light) and the open book (truth), and express the hope that both may flourish (as the grape) in a Christian land (the cross).*





# Academic Dress

*Academic dress originated in medieval times to provide warmth in the damp halls of learning. In its present form it includes a gown, hood (worn over the shoulders), and a cap or mortarboard. All universities have distinctive dress for each degree offered which explains the variety seen in the academic procession.*

*University of Winnipeg academic dress conforms to the North American Intercollegiate Code. All graduates wear a black gown which varies according to the degree conferred. The bachelor's gown is worn closed in front and is distinguished by its pointed sleeves. The master's gown is designed to be worn either open or closed in front and has closed sleeves with an opening to free the hands. The front portion of the sleeve below the opening has a long semi-circular cut-out. Doctorate gowns also may be worn open or closed. They are faced with velvet.*

*The edging colour on the hood indicates the faculty in which a degree is conferred: Theology—red; Science—gold; Education—blue; Arts—white. The width of the edging is determined by the degree: three inches for doctors; two inches for masters and bachelors. Hoods are lined in red with a white chevron.*

*Honorary doctors' gowns are red in colour and are faced with white velvet. They are worn with red Tudor bonnets. The hood colour signifies the honorary degree: white for Laws; golden yellow for Science; admiralty blue for Letters; purple for Divinity. Hoods are lined in red and white, The University of Winnipeg colours. Fellows wear a gown of blue with neither hat nor hood. Members of the University's senior administration wear gowns of varying colours. They do not wear hoods.*

# The Banner

*The banner, prominently displaying the Coat of Arms, was unveiled in 1988. The volunteer effort of Pat Corner, Fran Farquhar, Susan Ferguson, and Sonya C. Wright took more than 1000 hours. Over 400 metres of thread and 30 metres of wool material went into the project which uses such traditional techniques as quilting, embroidery, and crewel.*
