STRENGTHENING STUDENT SUCCESS IN THE INNER CITY

Math Leadership Camp—month-long program for 30 Indigenous youth—Wii Chiiwaakanak Learning Centre

Math Readiness Camp—week-long program for 20 Indigenous youth—Wii Chiiwaakanak Learning Centre

Sacred Seven—cultural teachings, Pow-Wow activities, healthy relationship lessons and academic supports—Wii Chiiwaakanak Learning Centre

Summer Adventures Kids Camp—providing nutrition, physical activity and science-based learning for 2,000 children

Let's Talk Science—offers hands-on activities in science, math and technology (grades 6–8)

The Collegiate Model School—high quality, individualized education for 50 inner-city students

In.Business Aboriginal Business Mentorship Program—national partnership with Cape Breton University matches Indigenous students with Indigenous business leaders

Tuition Credit Program—students from grades 4–12 earn money towards their UWinnipeg education

ENHANCING RESILIENCY AND LIFE-LONG LEARNING

The Opportunity Fund—supports inner-city and Indigenous students, new Canadians and refugees with fast-track bursaries

Tuition Waiver Program—students who have aged out of the child-welfare system receive bursaries covering their tuitions

Anishinaabemotaadidaa Language Immersion Camp—a week in residence in an immersive Ojibwe setting—Wii Chiiwaakanak Learning Centre

Community Learning Commons—free drop-in computer access and resume and skill building workshops —Wii Chiiwaakanak Learning Centre
